Be Specific and Crystal Clear

Provide Crucial Contex

Giving background information guides the Al's understanding and ensures that its answers are relevant to your specific needs, making interactions more effective.t





Specify Format & Length

Clearly stating the desired output format and length—whether a list, paragraph, or poem—helps the Al tailor its response to fit your exact requirements, saving you editing time.

<u>Define Persona & Tone</u>

Choosing the Al's voice and mood, such as friendly or formal, shapes the style of the output, ensuring it resonates with your audience and sounds more natural.





Use Examples to Guide

Providing examples of the style or structure you want allows the AI to mimic the pattern more accurately, which is especially useful for creative or complex tasks.

Break Down Complex Tasks into Smaller Chunks

Instead of asking for a full business plan, guide the Al step-by-step (e.g., name ideas → pick one → write mission). This keeps outputs clear, logical, and highquality.





terate and Refine Your Prompts

Think of prompt writing as an ongoing conversation, not a one-time command. If the Al's first response isn't quite right, don't worry—just tweak your wording, ask follow-up questions, or add more details.



Instead of listing everything the AI can't do, try guiding it with a clear but open prompt that leaves space for imagination. A bit of flexibility leads to more engaging and original results.





Use Negative Constraints Sparingly

Negative instructions like "don't include this" can confuse the Al and often backfire—say "write a joyful story about laughter and celebration" rather than "don't mention sadness or tears." Clear, positive direction leads to better, more focused results

Experiment and Learn from Every Interaction

The key to mastering Al prompts is regular experimentation. Try new styles, tweak your wording, and learn from each result—both hits and misses. Every interaction is a chance to improve your prompting skills, so don't be afraid to get creative or bend the rules now and then.
